What is DX Marathon?

An annual DXCC + WAZ chase

One big advantage: confirmations are not required

An excellent reason (excuse?) to get on the air and work DX

Compete with others or with yourself: beat last year's score

No complicated rules, just a few categories

As a year-long global event, geographical & other disadvantages even-out

DX Marathon

Originated in 1939 by Radio
Magazine, CQ's predecessor

Suspended in 1940 due to WWII

Resumed by CQ staff in 1948

Dropped in 1949

due to CQWW and DXCC

Resurrected in 2005 by
K9EL and CQ Magazine
to encourage activity by DXers
who have worked 'em all

Why participate?

Let's face it: for us, ham radio is DXing

DX Marathon challenges us to work the world every year

No multipliers or complicated formulas, no QSL cards required

Provides that extra incentive to remain active

Ideal for clubs ... but competition is optional: self-improvement is the main goal

How does it work?

Participation is easy: get on the air and chase DX as usual

At the end of the year, complete the entry form and upload to the DX Marathon website

DXCC plus 6 WAE entities:

- 3. IT Sicily EU-025

Eligible/Ineligible Frequencies

- Any authorized ham radio frequency from 2m-160m including WARC bands
- Contacts through repeaters or satellites are not allowed for credit
- Contacts with maritime or aeronautical mobile stations not allowed
- All contacts must be made entirely over amateur radio frequencies

DX Marathon classes

Unlimited

• Full license limits

Limited

- 100 watt maximum
- Yagi's with booms no longer than 16 feet, mounted no higher than 50 feet e.g. typical 3 ele tribander

Formula 100

- 100 watt maximum
- No gain antennas: simple wires and verticals

Formula 5

- 5 watt maximum
- Same antennas as Limited

DX Marathon categories

Single band / All band

 Focus on a single band 6 through 160 meters, including 60 meters

Single mode / All mode

- Challenge yourself or friends by maximizing your score on CW, phone or digital.
 - Digital includes RTTY, PSK, JT and FT modes and anything else that might be invented!

Club leagues

- An excellent tool to motivate and up-skill club members
- Compete among members and against other clubs

DX Marathon simplicity

Simple rules

- Use a single TX/RX site (station location)
- No multiple sites, no multiple remotes, no web SDR receivers • A remote site is OK so long as it is the only site you use
- Operating your home station locally or remotely is OK provided it is your only site • If you use than one site during the year, you can submit scores separately for each site

Your class

QSO data (date, time, band, mode & callsign) can be harvested from your ADIF log by DX Marathon tools

SCORING

Submitted logs are entered into a custom software program

Logged callsigns plus country and zone data are added to a large database

Each submission is checked for completeness

Most QSOs are validated automatically

Suspect call signs, incorrect zones etc. are manually checked by the DX Marathon staff

VERIFICATION

Honor system with very few infractions

DX stations may be contacted to verify logged QSOs if no online log exists

Any participant who violates the rules risks disqualification


When scoring is complete, the annual results write-up and plaques & certificates are prepared









2021 results summary

- 807 logs with 144,805 QSOs
- (1182/216505 in 2022) +46% Increase
- 274 entities + 40 zones = max score 314
- Overall error rate 1.5% lowest ever!
 - Most frequent errors:
 - Wrong zone 32%
 - Invalid calls 27%
 - Wrong country 23%
 - Busted calls 14%
- 71% were Unlimited
- 9% were single-band
- 27% were single-mode

- 267 Entities + 40 zones = max score 307
- Overall error rate 2.7%
 - Most frequent errors:
 - Wrong zone 17%
 - Invalid calls 21%
 - Wrong country 12%
 - Russian Policy- 28%
- 65% were Unlimited
- 5% were single-band
- 36% were single-mode

Most loggers do not flag the extra 6 CQ/WAE entities by default (so keep your ears and eyes open!)


The **DXLabs suite** has a DX Marathon specific module and can generate the entry form directly



Hints for a successful DX Marathon

- Work common countries throughout the year
- Track your progress (e.g. on Club Log), looking to fill all the 'easy' slots before the year ends
- Chase rare stations and DXpeditions keenly
- Double-check every callsign you log, especially DX!
 - Don't just trust DX spots!
- Update your logging program country database
- Preferentially claim QSOs that have been confirmed
- Use different QSOs to claim Zone and Country
 - Check your entry form for simple errors
 - Enter before the deadline!

Focus on a single band or mode to increase your chances of winning a plaque or certificate

Why Participate?

"For me, the Marathon is a great incentive to get on the air and work DX, even though I already have all entities confirmed, and have too many other fun activities to make a competitive effort. I'm very happy "running my own race" -- see if I can improve my results, add some Challenge band countries and digital contacts along the way, turn in a decent effort to support my local DX club's score, and keep the station running in top condition. I salute those of you who dedicate the time needed to compete for the awards!

"I participate because it gives me a goal that keeps me operating all year round, but where I can also step away for a week or two and not miss much. I love contesting, but sometimes I try to get ready for one of the big ones only to have last minute change of plans because of family or work.
